



What is Dry Farming?

- Crop production during a dry season like summers in the Willamette Valley and Northern California. *No irrigation is applied in the field.*
- Usually in a region that receives 20" or more of annual rainfall. In the Willamette Valley we receive 40+" of annual rainfall!
- Utilizes the residual moisture in the soil from the rainy season instead of depending on irrigation.

How does Dry Farming work?

- Starts with the soil! Deep soils with good water-holding capacity are ideal.
- Crop/cultivar selection – tomatoes, potatoes, melons, squash, dry beans, corn, orchard crops, and grapes can be dry farmed. Best to use deep rooted, drought tolerant, early maturing varieties.
- Soil preparation, timing, and planting technique are also important.
